Pricetown is a small cemetery. His grave would be easy to locate because all the other gravestones are old limestone and his is new & is white marble. His grave is located next to his son's grave, Samuel Lingo, behind the church.

Other Information:

Henry Lingo was born in Delaware in 1755. It is not known when he moved to Western Pennsylvania, but in 1775 he first enlisted into military service at Red Stone, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. He would not return home until 1783. He eventually married and had a family of nine children ~ two daughters and seven sons. By 1807 the family arrived in Trumbull County, Ohio and by 1813 they were settled on the family farm in Milton Township (now part of Mahoning County). Henry remained in Milton Township until his death in 1835.

Henry Lingo's pension records located in the National Archives Records Administration in Washington D.C. confirm that he was in the battles of Bound Brook, WoodBridge, Piscataway, Paoli and in many other skirmishes.

With the cooperation of the Ohio Society Sons of the American Revolution and the Department of Veterans Affairs, Dean and Nancy MacKenzie of Kenosha, Wisconsin made arrangements for a Government headstone to be placed on Henry Lingo's unmarked grave. It was installed in July 2006 with the assistance of local officials at the Pricetown Cemetery and Newton Township, Trumbull County. The MacKenzies also requested our assistance in placing the commemorative "Patriot" marker next to his headstone.

Dean is a member of the Elisha Raymond Chapter, Wisconsin Society SAR, Racine, Wisconsin and the PA 8th Brigade of the American Revolution in Canton, Ohio.
